

## **Official Schooling Day Rules**

The following guidelines are to be observed by all. Designated Cross Country and Show Jumping Officials will be monitoring the courses throughout schooling hours to ensure safety and compliance with all guidelines.

## ABSOLUTELY NO MOTORIZED VEHICLES ON CROSS COUNTRY COURSE (Official CHP vehicles only). Exception is electric bikes are allowed on schooling day only.

- Everyone who is schooling must be accompanied by a grounds person (who is at least 18 years old) on foot including mounted trainers. The grounds person must always remain within eyesight of the rider.
- Please ensure groups are limited to only 6 mounted schooling participants including mounted trainers in both SJ and XC areas.
- Riders may only school one level above where they are competing.
- On Cross Country, whenever possible, <u>please walk from jump to jump</u> so you don't startle horses waiting for a turn to practice.
- Please do not attempt to jump a XC fence until the rider(s) ahead of you have finished.
   Ask nearby coaches or riders if a fence is clear before attempting to jump.
- Horses must approach a jump with height in a forward gait (at least a trot) and be unassisted (not lead).
- Schooling is only permitted over flagged questions/jumps and only in the designated direction (white flag on left and red flag on right).
- Fences with crossed flags are not allowed to be jumped.
- Please try to keep your group moving along. If you need more time at a jump complex or in the SJ arena, take a break and let other riders school.
- Be polite and observant of other riders, horses, officials, volunteers, CHP staff, and grounds people.
- Please keep the health and safety of yourself and your horse a first priority. Stay
  hydrated and keep your horse as cool as possible with lots of breaks.
